Follower/Studio of Francesco Fanelli (1590-1653). A bronze figure group of the young Hercules strangling two serpents, *23cm high*, on a later marble socle, *30cm overall*. £10-15,000

Attributed to Severo de Ravenna. An early 16thC. Paduan bronze of a sea monster wrestling with a serpent, with a clam shell before him, a conch shell behind him, *20cm deep*, *17cm high (excluding spike)*, *10cm wide*, on bull-nose marble plinth, *21cm high overall*. £15-25,000

Manner of Niccolo Roccatagliata. A spectacular and important pair of bronze Andirons, 17thC and possibly later, each having a putti surmounted on a triform column supported by satyrs standing on ram's mask, over an arrangement of a figure seated on a lion flanked by putto standing on sea monsters, each supported by an iron two-prong stand, *92cm high*. £40-60,000.


