WELCOME TO THE FIRST PREVIEW OF 2008

The world of antiques continued to change with great velocity in 2007. Provincial firms of Chartered Arts & Antiques Surveyors created new record prices time and again. Expertise in marketing is becoming more important than specialist knowledge, although never a substitute.

Certain London firms are now charging 25% Buyers Premium and some are not even interested in lots with a value under £3,000. Are we are about to see a tidal change or just the continued ebb? Offering more competitive fees, equalling or exceeding professional service leaves one barrier to change; dispelling old fashioned myths and prejudices.

Attendance at viewing and sales in 2007 has been very encouraging. Demand remains strong for the right lots; prices have found new and ever changing levels. The best lots just seem to get better. Buyers have continued to become more focussed and selective in their collecting. The demand for the highest quality, condition and rarity is at a premium and so is the money being invested. Gold hit a 30-year high and the market is desperate for such items to appear at auction as alternative investments.

Our highlights of 2007 were the introduction of 'Live' internet bidding at the Quarterly Sales, a world record price for a watercolour by Harold Knight R.A. (1874-1961) and achieving 'Regulated by RICS' status.

The last is probably the most important to us. Unfortunately there is still no legal requirement for auctioneers to be qualified or regulated. Professional advisers such as solicitors and accountants would never instruct unqualified individuals or non-regulated firms, so why still do the general public and certain elements of the trade? This factor only seems to be important when something goes wrong. Better Regulation of us means Better Protection for you!

In 2008 we look forward to February 6th Quarterly Sale which is now online. The 7th May Quarterly Sale is highlighted by Medals awarded to Battle of Britain flying ace Group Captain R W Oxspring RAF (cover illustration). To be sold upon instruction from the executors of his late widow, together with dress medals, logbooks and associated items.

Robert Wardlow Oxspring was born in Sheffield on 22nd May 1919, the son of a World War 1 decorated pilot of the same name. He joined the RAF in March 1938 on a short service commission and joined 66 Sqn. in the December and started operational flying in July 1940 and flew throughout the Battle of Britain. He was shot down by Bf 109's over Kent on 25thOctober, baling out with slight injuries (Caterpillar Club Badge) He was awarded the DFC on 8th November. September 1942 saw him awarded a bar to the DFC and a second bar was added in February 1943. In 1946 he was awarded the Dutch Vligerkruis by Royal Decree of the 31st October 1946 appearing in the London Gazette on 10th January 1947. He was awarded an AFC in January 1949 after leading a team of 54 Sqn Vampires to Canada and the USA, the first jet aircraft to cross the Atlantic. He retired from the service with the rank of Group Captain, having been Station Commander of RAF Gatow, Germany, in 1968 and settled in Lincolnshire near to RAF Cranwell. He died on 8th August 1989. Total Claims:13 and 1 shared destroyed, 2 probable, 13 damaged and 4 V-1s destroyed.

Finally, we can announce instructions from the Executors of the highly respected and knowledgeable antiques dealer Colin Wilson. In our Quarterly Sale on 30th July the market will decide the fate of two small bronze monkeys for which evidence suggests they could well be by the famous Flemish sculptor Giovanni Bologna, known as Giambologna (1529-1608) from the fountain of Samson and a Philistine. The July sale will also include a private collection of bronzes that were consigned in 2001 for inclusion at the time when the monkeys were to be sold.


