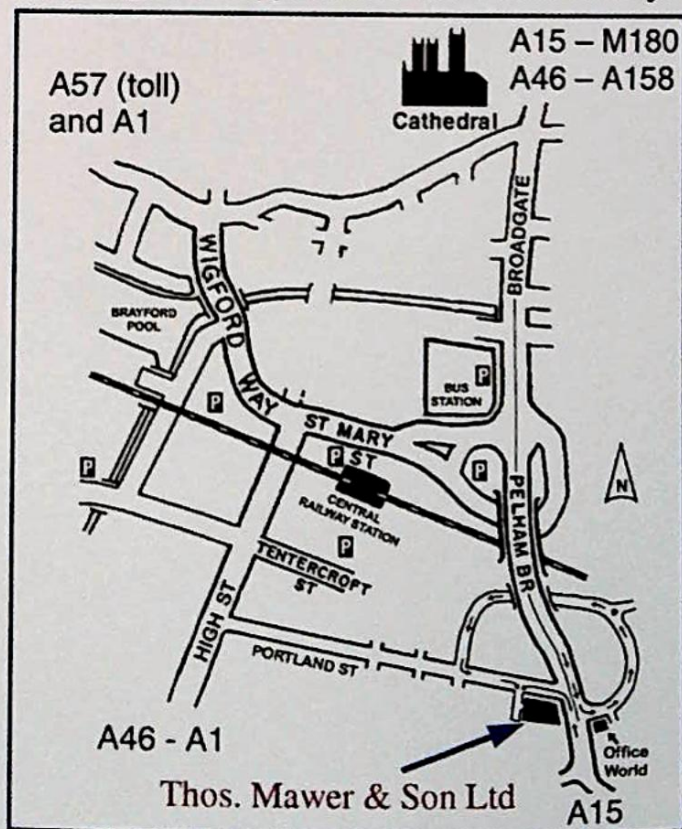

CONDITIONS OF SALE
